Position Summary

- The Kinesiologist works as a member of the Brantford "Caring for My COPD" community
 program. The role will work collaboratively with the other interdisciplinary members of the team
 which includes an Occupational Therapist, Social Worker and Registered Dietitian to provide
 safe and effective programs for the COPD program clients and clients with other chronic
 conditions that could benefit from a structured physical activity program i.e. diabetes,
 hypertension, dyslipidemia etc.
- The Kinesiologist will be responsible for the development and delivery of personal fitness programs which may be delivered in individual or group settings.
- Hours of work– primarily days however this position will be required to work a minimum of 1 to 2 evenings per week; weekend work as required.

Qualifications

- Bachelor Degree in Kinesiology
- Registration with the College of Kinesiologists of Ontario
- Current CPR and First Aid Certification
- Experience in providing safe, effective and evidence based programs in a chronic disease management setting
- Demonstrated knowledge of COPD, medications typically prescribed for COPD and their actions
- Demonstrated knowledge of the benefits and contraindications related to exercise
- Demonstrated ability to work with older adults that have issues with mobility
- 1-2 years of experience in a clinical setting preferred
- Excellent interpersonal, organizational, written and verbal communication skills essential
- Knowledge of and experience with group facilitation and co-facilitation
- Ability to work independently and in self-directed working conditions
- Experience working with electronic medical records (EMR)

Responsibilities & Skills:

- Assessment of physical capacity of individuals referred to the program
- Development of safe and effective exercise prescriptions
- Work collaboratively with COPD team members and other system partners (medical providers and other community teams supporting similar clients) to develop, coordinate and execute the clients COPD care plan
- Lead exercise classes or individual exercise sessions using a variety of equipment to improve physical endurance, strength and flexibility
- Create and lead group education sessions that are evidence-based
- Participate in team meetings and in program evaluation activities
- Able to travel within the Brantford-Brant-Norfolk OHT area
