The International Agricultural Worker (IAW) Healthcare clinics are staffed with qualified Interpreters to support clients who experience a language barrier. The role of the Interpreter is to facilitate verbal communication by conveying, as faithfully as possible, a message between two parties who do not share the same language (clients with clinic staff). In a healthcare setting the Interpreter must facilitate clear and accurate communication between patients and health care providers.

This position will include travel to various farms and clinic locations in Brantford, Haldimand-Norfolk and Hamilton. Hours of work include days, evenings and weekends with increased hours from May –October.

- Previous experience as an interpreter in the area of health an asset
- Knowledge of medical terminology
