Specific functional areas of responsibility include (but are not limited to) health assessment, diagnosis, therapeutics (pharmacological, complementary, and counselling interventions), and the development of treatment plans in collaboration with the client, family, and other GRCHC staff as required.

The NP will work collaboratively within an interdisciplinary team, ensuring high-quality, patientcentred care that aligns with GRCHC's mission and values.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conduct comprehensive health assessments, diagnosis, treatment, and management of acute and chronic conditions.
- Develop and implement individualized care plans in collaboration with patients and interdisciplinary team members.
- Prescribe medications and other therapeutic interventions in accordance with scope of practice.
- Provide health education, counselling, and support to patients and families to promote overall well-being.
- Collaborate with physicians, social workers, dietitians, and other health professionals to ensure coordinated care.

- Maintain accurate electronic medical records and documentation in accordance with regulatory and organizational guidelines.
